MHSI MANDATE AND MISSION

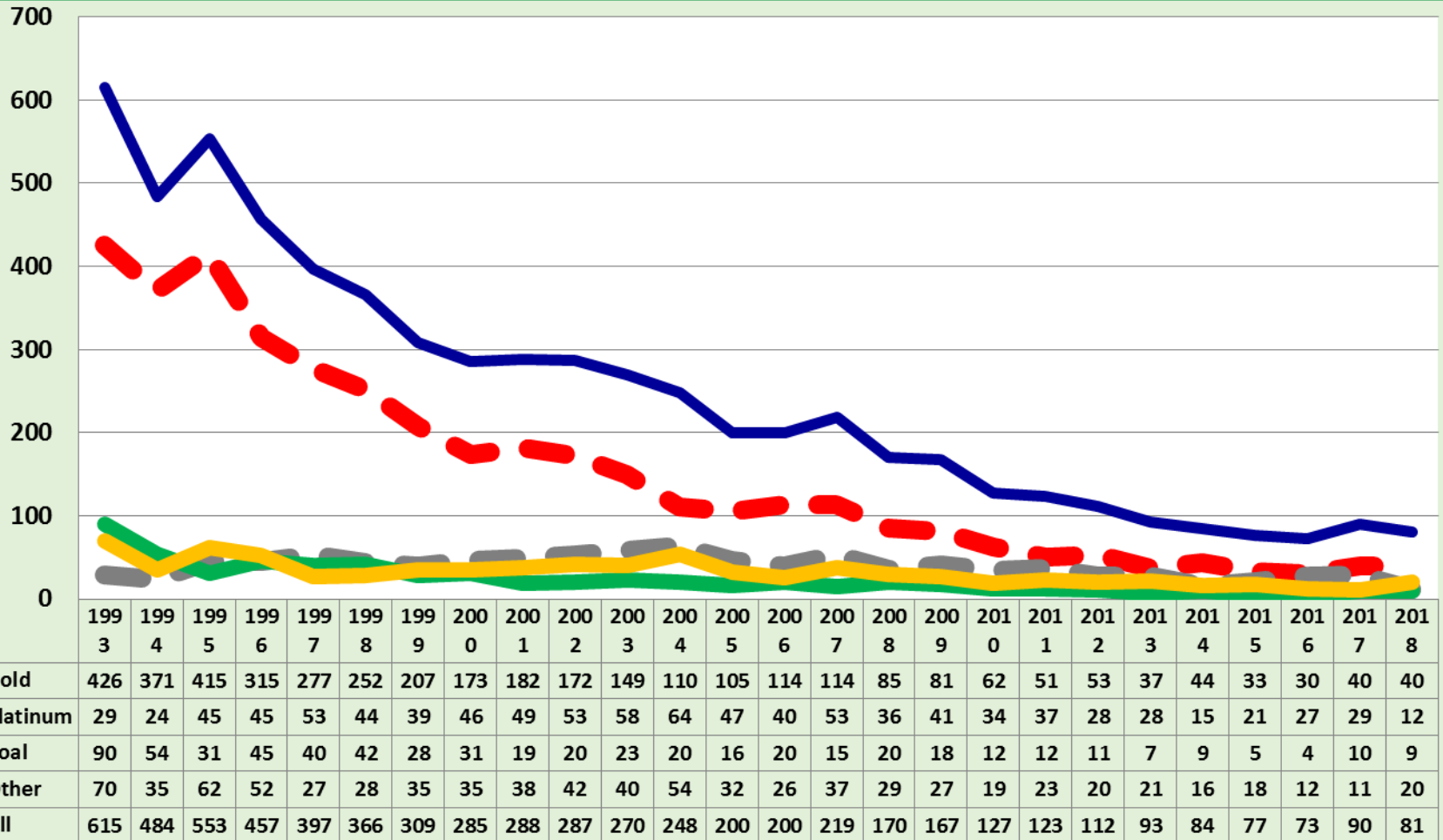
MANDATE

To execute the Department's mandate to safeguard the health and safety of mine employees and people affected by mining activities.

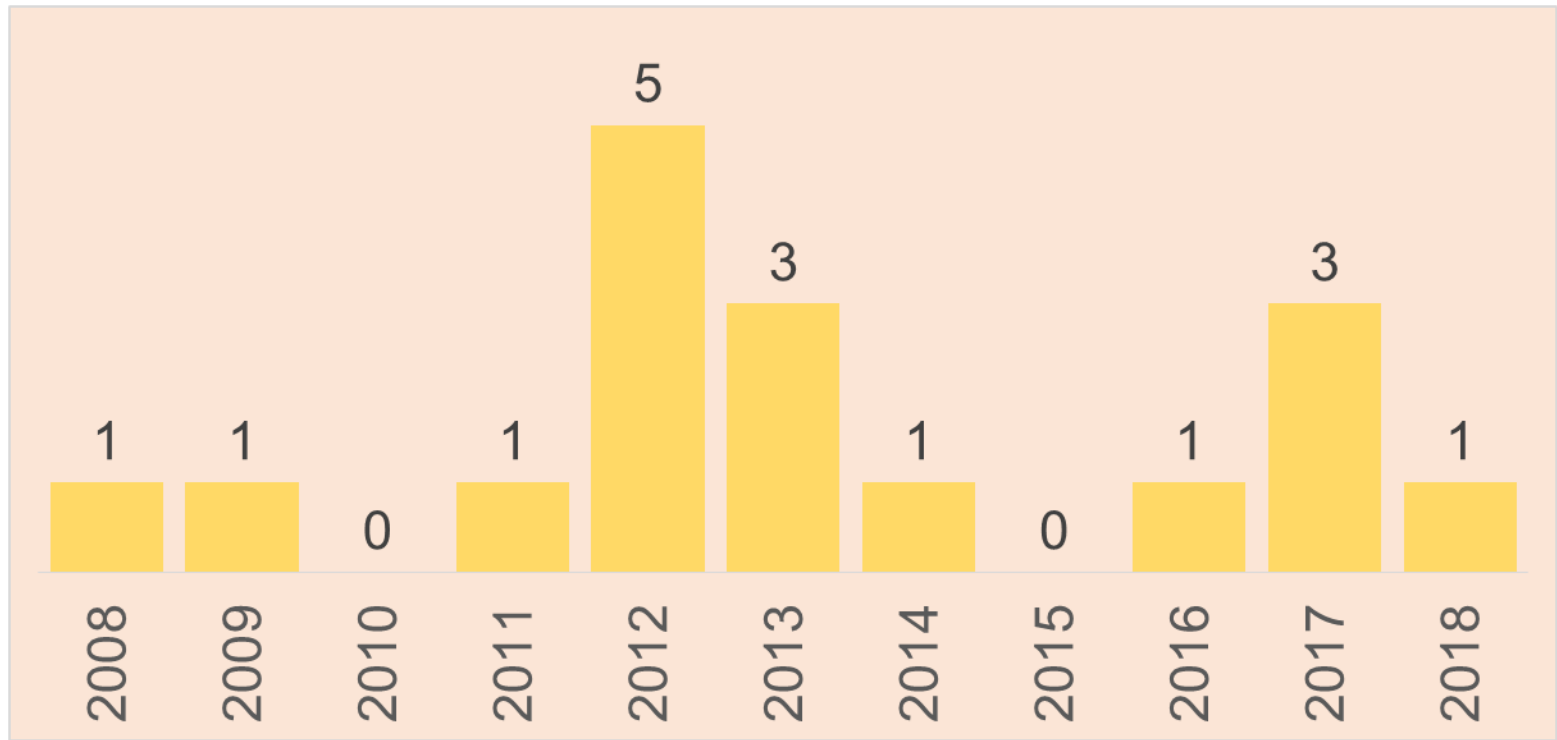
MISSION STATEMENT

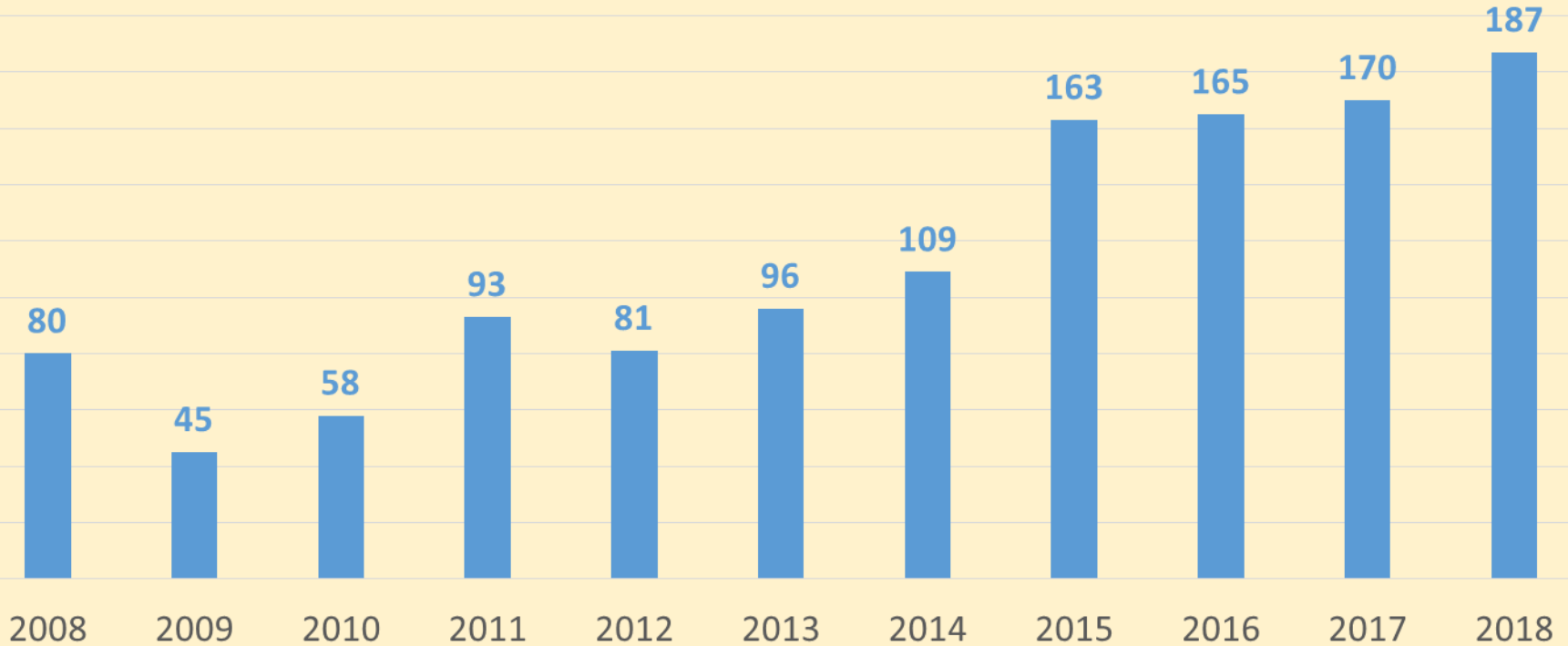
Fatalities by Commodity



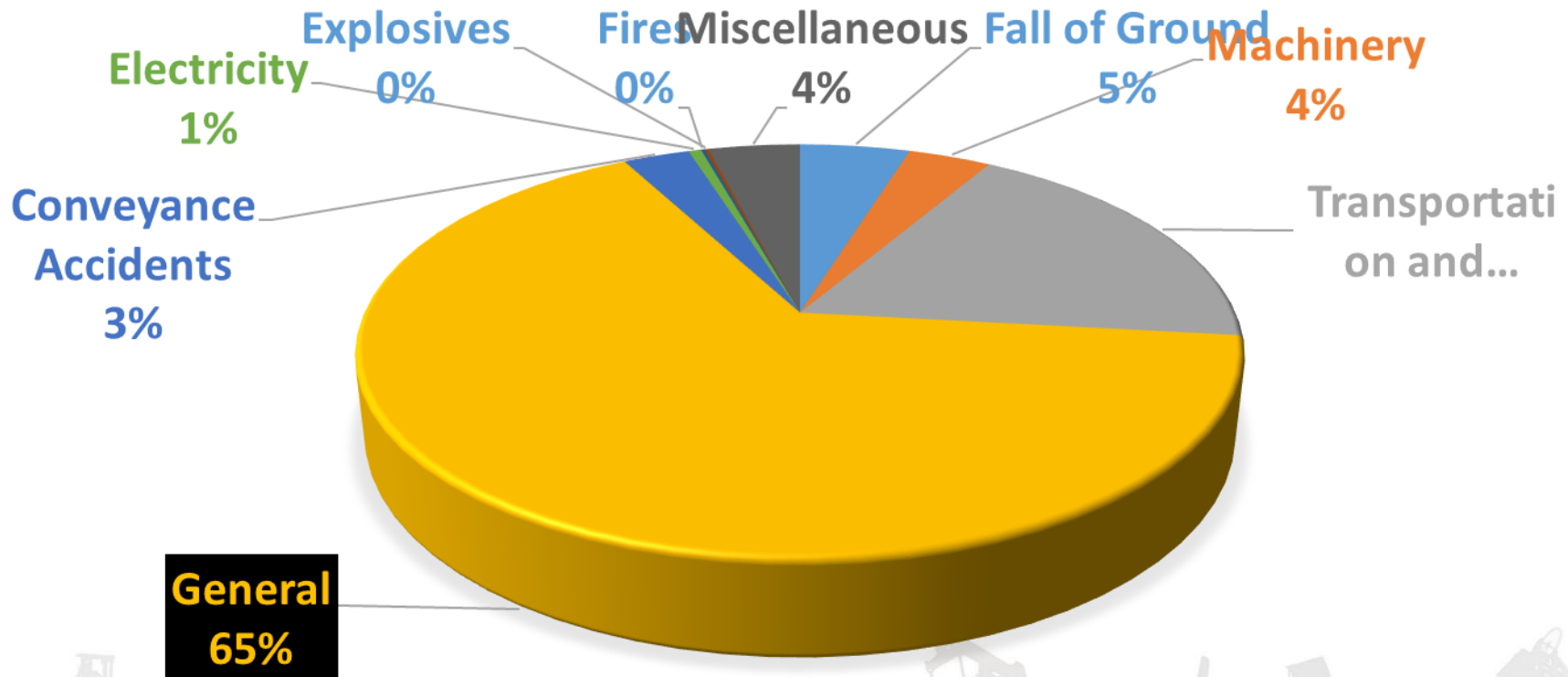
Women fatalities

- Support and promotion of the WIM initiative

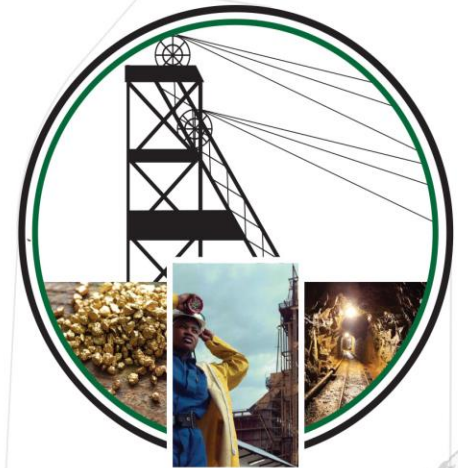
Conclusion
